The Wondrous Variety From The Hearty Olive

As you cross the Olive Route, you can savour three common and popular Olive varieties in Türkiye.

Domat, found throughout the Turkaegean, are larger olives with green Memecik olives are mid-sized olives with a slightly oval shape. It offers a rich taste due to its high oil content.

Milas olive oil received recognition from the EU. The European Union registered it for a protected designation of origins and Türkiye's relationship with the olive is sacred. And getting in touch with nature along the route, you will soon discover why Türkiye is one of the top 5 olive producers in the world.

Join, cook, eat, repeat!

When venturing southwards to Aydin, the visitors can learn about the history of olives, meet the families who cultivate the olive groves, help with the harvest, and set their taste buds on fire with the olives and olive oil-based dishes to reflect on the connection between the land's olive and olive oil.



The story of the tree

Olive cultivation and olive oil production have been a part of this region's daily life and culture since ancient times. Travelling further down, on your way to Izmir, you may visit the tree of Kirkağac in Manisa. Izmir, the pearl of the Turkaegean, is considered among the most important centres of olive cultivation and oil in Türkiye. Here the Museum traces the 4000-year history of olive production.



Harvest Prayer

The Olive route is a journey and legume production, with coasts to two different seas. And the oil presses on the Turkaegean coast and beyond. A short visit to the Adatepe Olive Oil Museum in Çanakkale is how the route begins and where you may hear locals say "Harvest Prayer". Here you can see traditional crushing and extraction methods in their mill, which serves as the first Olive Oil Museum in Türkiye.

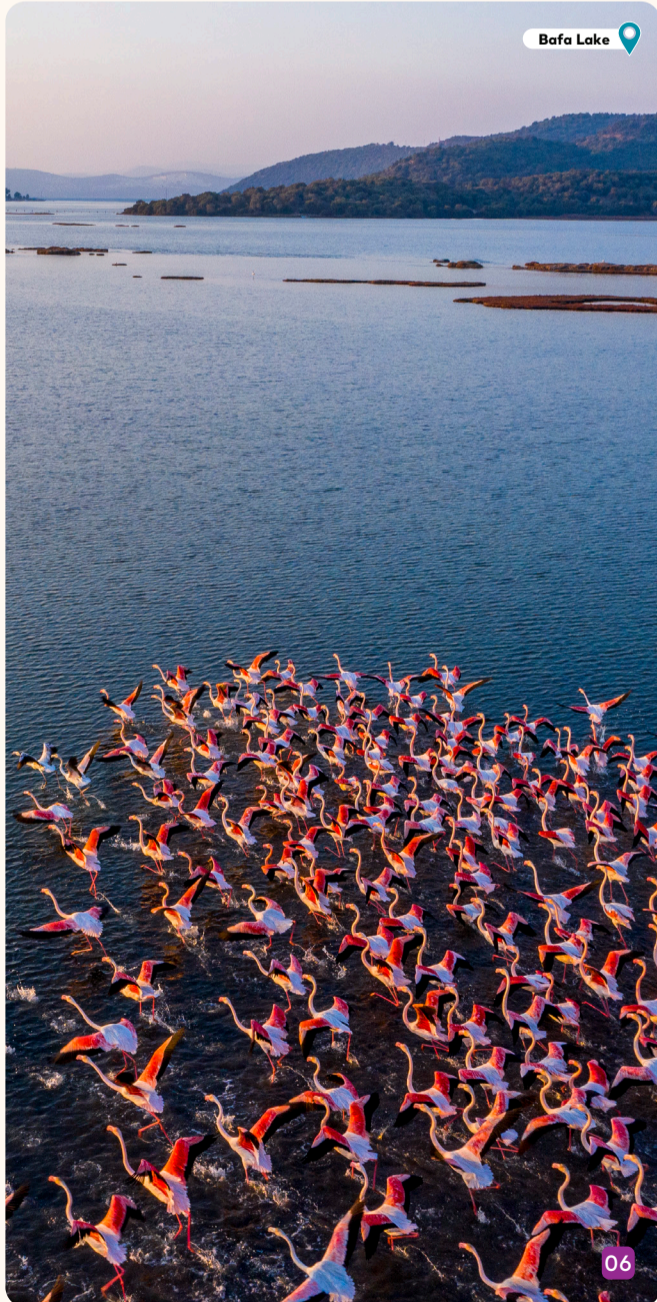

Worth A Detour

- Among the ruins of the acropolis in Ayvacık, the **Temple of Athena** is the best place to watch the magnificent view of **Edremit Bay** at sunset.
- Stop at **Zeus Altar** in **Adatepe** and see the ancient Gods' view. Homer mentions in the Iliad Epic that Gods lived on Mount Ida (Kazdağı) and watched and ruled the Trojan War from here.
- On your way towards **Ayvalık**, stop by in **Edremit** and join a trekking tour in the **Kaz Dağı National Park** (Kazdağı Milli Parkı).
- Visit **Şeytan Sofrası** (Devil's Feast) and enjoy the marvellous sunset in **Ayvalık**
- Alaçatı**, in Çeşme, is the perfect location for windsurfers and kitesurfer
- The farm-to-table fine dining experience in **Urla**
- Stroll through **Siğacık Pazarı** (open market) at **Seferihisar**, a beautiful coastal town, and the first Cittaslows in Türkiye
- In **Selçuk**, visit one of the most beautiful ancient sites of the world, **Ephesus** and its environs, including the remains of the **Temple of Artemis**, the famous **Celsus library**, **Church of Mary** and the **Basilica of St John** on the acropolis of Ephesus, **Ayasuluk Hill**.
- Dive in **Kuşadası**, a popular holiday spot on Türkiye's Aegean coast, which has one of the more unusual dive sites in the form of an A300 Airbus.
- Visit **Bafa Lake**, the largest lake in the Aegean Region. Besides having at least 2000 years old olive trees in the region, the lake is of great importance for water birds during winter. Many raptors, especially long-legged predators, can be seen between October and April when the water level is high. Bird watchers and those interested in bird watching can take a break in this region and easily observe different bird species.
